In three-quarters of a century Boys & Girls Village (BGV) developed from a 'boys village' to a leader in specialized care and education for emotionally troubled children. Our dedication to offering a wide range of progressive behavioral health services and utilizing innovative trauma and evidence-based treatments has transformed over 30,000 lives, building brighter futures for at-risk children and families across the state.



This year has been a year of great change. On our Milford campus we broke ground on the expansion of Charles F. Hayden upper school to include 11th and 12th grade, and celebrated our very first graduating class. Construction began on a new program and administrative building offering expanded space for our services, and we opened a new outpatient site in Norwalk to provide services to a growing lower Fairfield County client base.

While we are excited about these accomplishments and thank the State of Connecticut for their generous grants, we are most proud of the lives we are changing, including the 811 clients served this year. The children and families we work with are facing immense challenges brought on by the endless cycle of poverty, abuse and hopelessness. We're committed to consistently providing a comprehensive range of programs so that each child can be given the specific help that they need.

BGV's innovative programming is focusing more than ever on older children who need specific and tangible skills to allow them to become self-sufficient and emotionally stable. Our Work to Learn program has trained nearly 200 young adults from the foster care system in job skills, life skills and financial management, teaching them the value of saving and purchasing assets for the future.

Our advances in improving the well-being of at-risk children and families could not be possible without you. Thank you for supporting our commitment to improving the lives of those that need our services most. Together, we're building stronger communities and greater futures for us all.





With 220 full time staff members, who speak more than 10 languages, BGV's residences, clinics, school, and offices are bustling with energy and enthusiasm every day. BGV's VP of Education and Vocational Services, Jon Oddo, sees firsthand the dedication of his staff. "It is so impressive to see effort happening 24 hours a day to help save the lives of our families. Since being at BGV for five years now, I have never met a more flexible group of people who will sacrifice their personal lives to continue to find creative ways to help others taste success for the first time."

In September, BGV held its annual Staff Appreciation Day where staff members are treated with a day of fun including food trucks, raffles, a chance to use the high ropes course, and lots of games. This celebration is certainly well-deserved. Behavioral Health

Behavioral Health services continue to be the cornerstone of BGV's mission. With seven distinct programs, we can offer the best evidence-based and individualized treatment for each child. We offer both in-home and outpatient services, as well as residential care, and after-school programs. With a focus on building opportunities to create new and better futures, BGV helps a wide range of clients including children who have experienced severe trauma, children with problem sexual behavior, children who would otherwise be institutionalized, and families with children at risk of substance abuse

This year, in order to provide more convenience and better services to our growing client base in lower Fairfield County, BGV opened a new site in Norwalk. We operate a clinic in Bridgeport and offer multiple programs at our Bridgeport and Milford campuses.

Permanency Planning

BGV's Permanency Planning programs are dedicated to keeping children with their families when possible, and otherwise providing them with a safe, permanent home. Through our statewide Therapeutic Foster Care, our Intensive Family Preservation program, and our Reunification and Therapeutic Family Time Program, we are able to fulfill an essential component of a child's life: a consistent place to call home.

School

Charles F. Hayden School, BGV's K-12th grade state approved special education school, helps children grow academically while also learning how to manage their own emotional and behavioral challenges. Hayden School uses the most up-to-date technology and curriculum, a full treatment team for each child, and diverse experiential activities to ensure every student's individual success. Our goal is to guide students to high school graduation or to return them to their own schools back home.

Vocational Programming

BGV prepares young adults who come from challenging backgrounds with the skills needed to successfully enter adulthood. Hayden School has a pre-vocational and vocational program that begins to train students in job and life skills as early as age 14.

We are also one of three agencies in Connecticut that offer the Work to Learn program for kids and young adults in the State's foster care system. This innovative program offers youth-run businesses and teaches on-the-job skills training. Participants also learn life skills and financial literacy and are encouraged to open their own savings accounts. As an incentive, BGV provides a 100% savings match upon completed classes to support the purchase of assets.

The goal of Work to Learn is to give underprivileged children, who would otherwise be entering adulthood with little hope for success, the building blocks to achieve a steady job, savings, and a safe, healthy future.
